



ANTI-WAR STRIKE

Inside Story of the 'Illegal' May Day Port Shut Down

On May Day 2008, members of the International Longshore and Warehouse Union (ILWU) shut down every port on the Pacific Coast from San Diego to Seattle in opposition to the U.S.-led war in Iraq. This was the first time in American history a union went on strike against a bosses' war.

Jack Heyman is the militant dockerman and executive board member of San Francisco ILWU Local 10 who initiated the action. His proposal was overwhelmingly supported by rank-and-file delegates at a union conference in February 2008. The strike took place despite the furious opposition of the bosses, two negative rulings by a labor arbitrator and foot-dragging by the union's top leadership.

This powerful workers' action is a truly historic event that provides a model for union activists in Canada and around the world who want to organize effective opposition to the occupation of Iraq and Afghanistan.
